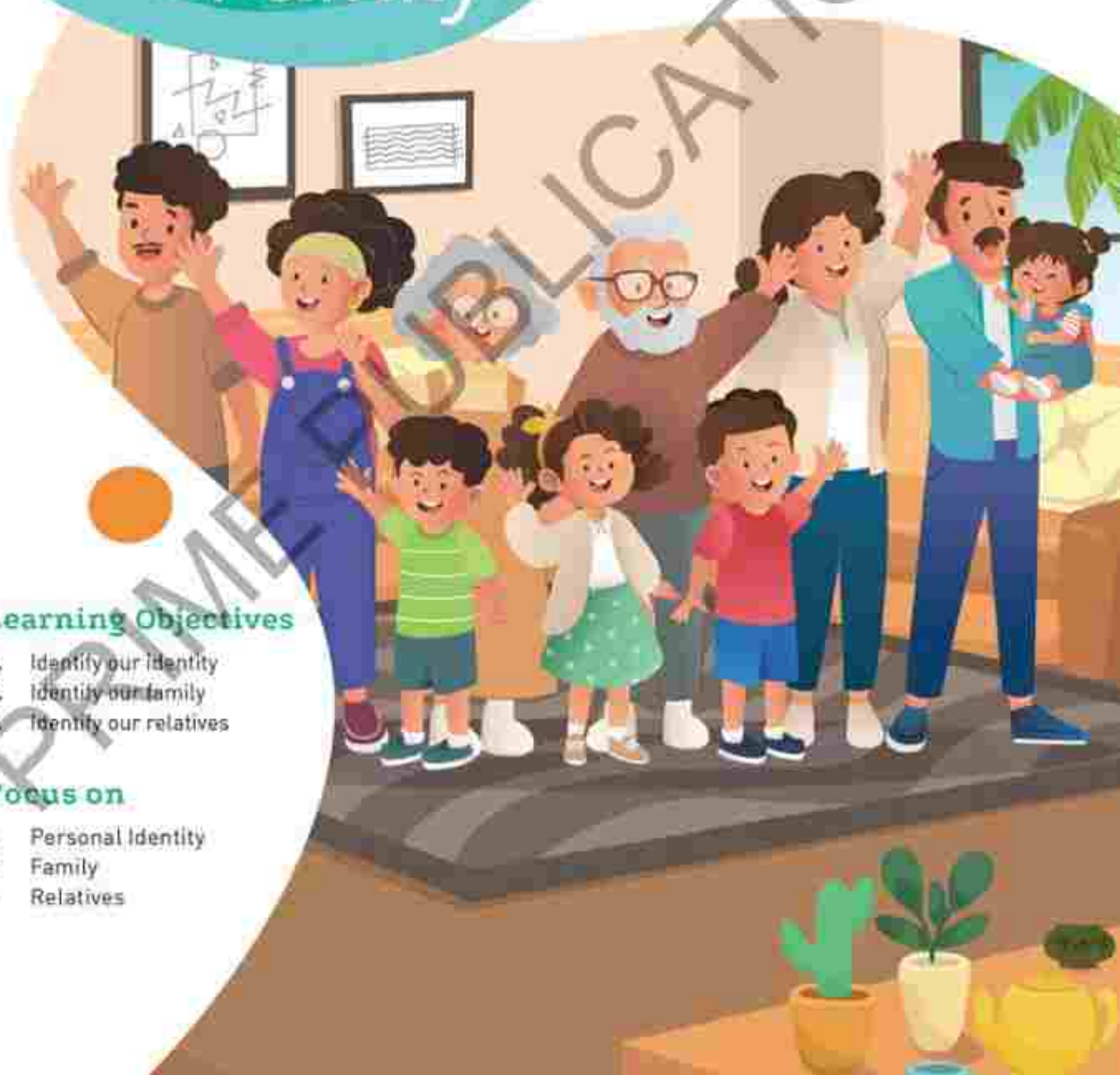

What is Personal Identity?

Personal identity is what makes you special.

Your name, address, date of birth, and place of birth, are parts of your identity.

We need these to join school and make friends.

Without these information, we cannot do many things.

Your name is what people call you.

Your name is given by your parents when you were born.

Your address is where you live and helps people to find your house.

Your date and place of birth tell us when and where we were born.

Be safe! Phone number is also part of your identity. If we are not careful when sharing our information, someone might use it in the wrong way.

We have to be careful when giving our personal information, especially to strangers.

A stranger is someone you do not know well.

Some strangers are kind and want to help, but we still have to be careful.

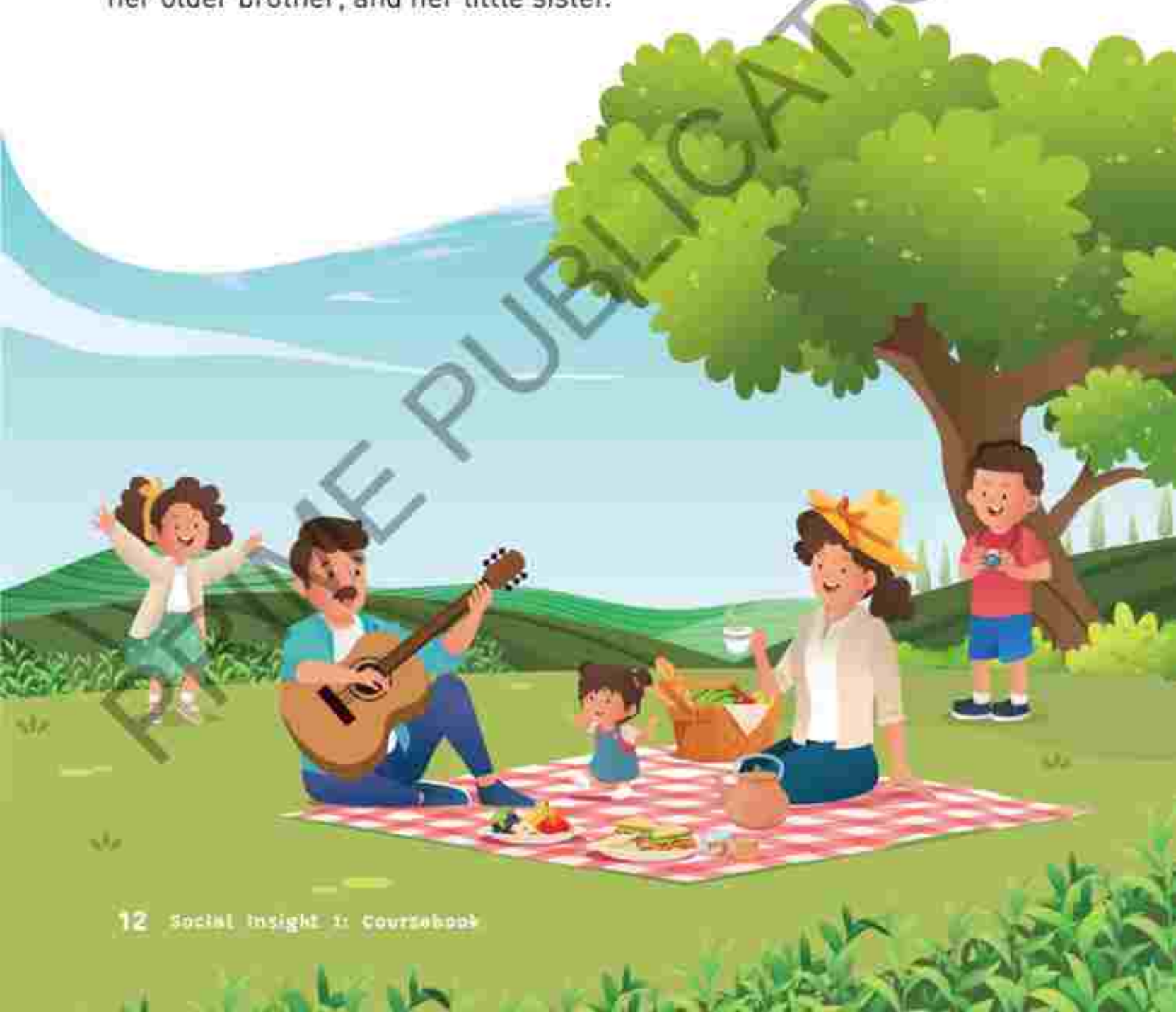
Robin's Family

Robin and Lucy are James and
Adeline's daughters.

Relatives

Relatives are your family too.
They usually live in another house.

Grandparents, uncles, aunts,
and cousins are your relatives in the family.

Grandparents are your mother
and father's parents.

Uncles and aunts are your
parents' brothers and sisters.

Cousins are your uncle
and aunt's children.
